Explosion or fire as a result of ignition of petrol



Skin irritation from contact with petrol/diesel or inhalation injuries from petrol/diesel vapour



Environmental pollution from spillages

Safe System of Work

- 1. You must wear disposable gloves when handling fuel.
- 2. Safety goggles must be worn in case of splash back.
- 3. Only refuel equipment in a designed well-ventilated area, away from sources of ignition and in the shade.
- 4. Do not smoke or use a mobile phone while handling fuel.
- 5. Ensure a spill kit is available and within easy access.
- 6. Always refuel over a drip tray or plant nappies.
- 7. Equipment must be turned off.
- 3. Allow equipment that has recently been used to cool down before refueling.
- 9. Where appropriate use a funnel.
- 10. Clean up any spillages immediately. Small spillages can be wiped up and a spill kit must be used for larger spills.
