Safe System of Work

- 1. Equipment must be on a firm and perfectly level surface.
- 2. Ensure the lid is down before switching the machine on.
- 3. All operating and isolating switches should be conveniently accessible.
- 4. Ensure the lid is down before switching the machine on.
- 5. Keep hair, hands clothing and cloths away from moving machine parts.
- 6. Cutlery must be clean and wet or come directly from the dishwasher.
- 7. Turn equipment off, disconnect from the power supply before attempting to clear a blockage.
- 8. Take care when handling cutlery, in particular when clearing a blockage, to avoid cuts or puncture injuries.
- 9. Turn equipment off and disconnect from the power supply before changing the polish granules.
- 10. Clean up spillages as they occur and use wet floor warning signs when appropriate.

If you have any concerns, stop and speak with your line manager before proceeding.
