

LESSONS LEARNT	
Type of Incident:	Injury — First
Classification of Incident:	Burns and Scalds.
Summary of Incident:	IP was uncovering a container of peas that had been cooked in the combi oven and when taking the cling film off the container some of the mushy peas in the container splashed onto their knuckle causing a small red mark from the heat of the mush peas - this occurred in the Kitchen at Magnox Hinkley Point and only the IP was involved in the incident.

Root Causes:	Route cause of incident – Lack of attention due to rushing. IP not following developed procedures - rushing due to tight schedule. IP identified on the statement that they were indeed rushing. IP has been trained to the correct level and understood all risk and controls in in
	place which is evident on the training cards.
Immediate Action Taken:	This was reported to a Mitie first aider who advised to run knuckle under cold water for 20 minutes also advised not to submerge in water or wear glove the rest of the day.
Lessons Learnt:	Responsibility: It is the responsibility of the staff member to indicate to their Supervisors/Manager if they are running out of time – to ask for help rather than rush which will increase the chances of an accident happening. Communication: Ask for help.

Actions to be Taken (By Whom)	 Site Manager: to undertake a HS meeting demonstrating you have gone through – Burns and scalds - reminding staff not to rush and take their time/ if they require help ask – document training complete and planned. Site Manager: to Review RA/SSoW Post incident to ensure findings from the incident can be learnt and add additional controls where possible to prevent a recurrence. Site Manager: to Review PPE and PPE requisition and also add any additional PPE to the RA/SSoW which applies. Site Manager: to Undertake a managers audit here to identify any further issues that may require attention to reduce the risk of a recurrence.
	Site Manager: to Reassign ABC Burns and Scalds to all staff on AccessPlanit.
