Safe System of Work

- 1. Empty the lint filter prior to use.
- 2. Ensure the dryer vent is not covered.
- 3. Use trolleys or roll cages to transport laundry bags and avoid manual handling.
- +. Never put contaminated or dirty items in the dryer.
- 5. Items containing foam rubber or other rubber-like materials must not be dried in a tumble dryer.
- 6. Do not leave a tumble dryer running unattended or overnight.
- 7. Always use the cool-down function on the tumble dryer.
- 8. Remove items from the dryer once the cycle has completed.
- 9. Dried laundry must not be packed tightly into trolleys, laundry bags, cupboards etc., but be vented and cooled before it is stored or packed.

If you have any concerns, stop and speak with your line manager before proceeding.
