## Robotic cleaner

## Safe System of Work

- 1. Only use the robotic cleaner if you have been trained to do so.
- Follow the manufacturer's instructions.
- 3. Visually check equipment for any damage prior to use. Report damage to your manager and do not use damaged equipment.
- 4. Do not handle the robotic cleaner with wet hands or if it has become wet.
- 5. Manual handling precautions must be observed when moving the machine into position
- 6. Only use the robotic cleaner when pedestrian traffic is minimal and only in mapped locations.
- 7. Do not use it is crowded locations, on steep slopes, near stairs or outside.
- Never sit on or ride on the robot.
- Do not use it near combustible materials or chemicals.
- 10. Always turn equipment off and disconnect it from the charging point before cleaning it.
- 11. Only use the chemical specified for the equipment and do not spray it directly onto the equipment.
- 12. Only use the charger provided for the unit being charged and visually inspect for damage before use.
