Safe System of Work

- 1. When using a portable guillotine, make sure it is positioned on a stable surface with adequate lighting and workspace.
- 2. Check that the guillotine is fitted with all necessary safety guards and that they are in good working order.
- 3. Keep clothing, hair, lanyards and jewellery away from moving parts and the cutting blade so they cannot become entrapped in the guillotine.
- 4. Guillotines must only be used for the purpose intended, such as cutting paper, card, acetate films and laminates.
- 5. Do not exceed the capacity of the equipment and overload the guillotine.
- 6. If using a manually operated guillotine for prolonged periods, take regular breaks.
- 7. You must be over 18 years of age and trained to dismantle and clean a guillotine.

If you have any concerns, stop and speak with your line manager before proceeding.
