Safe System of Work

1. Only use the equipment if you have been trained to do so and always follow the manufacturer's instructions.
2. You must wear appropriate PPE, including reinforced toe-caped safety shoes and protective gloves when using equipment.
3. Make sure you are familiar with the location and function of the operating switches, including the emergency switch.
4. Check the guard and door are in place and do not operate if these are missing or faulty.
5. Keep clothing, lanyards etc away from moving parts so they cannot become entangled and drawn into equipment.
6. Keep hands away from moving parts.
7. Ensure that waste contains only compostable items and do not exceed the daily maximum capacity.
8. Use correct manual handling practices when decanting waste.
9. Clean up any spillages as they occur and use wet floor warning signs when appropriate.
10. Before dusting the electrical board, the machine must be shut off and disconnected from the power supply.
11. When cleaning the exterior, do not spray equipment with water, but wipe down with a damp cloth.
12. Depending on the location of equipment lone working and associated risks may need to be considered.
