Safe System of Work

- 1. Wherever practicable, ensure that work tasks are rotated to avoid long periods of repetitive work activity.
- 2. Keep clothing and oven cloths out of reach of rotating parts to prevent them from becoming entangled.
- 3. Dispose of any broken glass and crockery by putting it in the designated broken glass and crockery bin or wrap it securely in cardboard before placing it in general waste.
- 4. Clean up spillages as they occur and use wet floor warning signs when appropriate.

What are the hazards and how might they harm?



Back, upper arm and neck pains due to repetitive movements



Slip injuries from spillages



Cuts/lacerations from broken glass and crockery

Crush injuries. bruises.

abrasions as a result of

What other precautions should be taken?



Clean up any spillages immediately



Use a dust pan and brush to clean up broken glass
