Back and muscle strain from manual handling

Pinching injuries when assembling/disassembling





Trip injuries from guy ropes or obstructions

Fire

Safe System of Work

- 1. Follow the manufacturer's instructions where these are available.
- 2. Consider the location of the gazebo or tent, ensuring that is located away from sources of heat, such as generators, and overhead power cables, and that the ground is flat.
- 3. Ensure the gazebo or tent is suitable for the purpose and that it is fire retardant to BS 7837:1996 or equivalent.
- 4. Consider the current and forecast weather conditions before erecting a gazebo or tent. They should not be erected during heavy rain or snow, strong winds, hail or thunderstorms.
- 5. Gazebos and tents, including pop-ups, should be set up and broken down by a team of at least two.
- 6. Keep hands and fingers away from moving parts to prevent pinch or entrapment injuries.
- 7. Legs must be anchored, e.g. with guy ropes and tent pegs or weighted down, e.g. with sandbags. Ensure guy ropes are clearly visible to prevent trips.
- 8. Ensure the roof is pulled taught, so that there is no build-up of rainwater, snow, leaves etc.
- 9. Ensure that there is an easily accessible escape route from the gazebo or tent, that is free of obstructions and trip hazards.
- 10. Where electric or gas equipment is to be used in the gazebo or tent firefighting equipment must be provided.
- 11. Where appropriate a first aid kit should be provided.
- 12. The gazebo or tent must be clean and dry before it is put away to prevent mould growth.
