

#### What are the hazards and how might they harm?



Serious cuts and amputation from contact with sharp blade



Electric shock or burns from incorrect use or damaged/faulty equipment



Crush injuries, bruises, abrasions as a result of entanglement



Slip injuries from spillages

### What other precautions should be taken?



You must be trained and 18 years of age or older to dismantle and clean the equipment



Clean up any spillages immediately

## **Use of waste disposal machines**

### Safe System of Work

- 1. All operating and isolating switches are should be conveniently accessible.
- 2. Check the guards are in position and that safety interlocks are in good working order. If not, do not use the waste disposal machine and report it to your manager.
- 3. Keep clothing and cloths away from moving machine parts so that they cannot become entangled and drawn into the machine.
- 4. Equipment must be electrically isolated before attempting to remove blockages.
- 5. Clean up spillages as they occur and use wet floor warning signs when appropriate.

If you have any concerns, stop and speak with your line manager before proceeding.
