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<b>Procedure – Preparing solution - Dispensing from a 5L container into a trigger spray or scrubber dryer/bucket</b>	
<b>Spray Bottle Stage 1</b>	Fill correctly labelled trigger spray with 600ml of water and add 30ml of Neomax BMR via pelican pump.
<b>Mop Bucket Stage 1</b>	Dispense product into water filled scrubber dryer or bucket using pelican pump or measuring cup 30ml per 10l of water.
<b>Stage 2</b>	<u>For new surfaces, test a small area for compatibility. Do not use if reaction occurs</u>

<b>When removing or replacing pelican/feed pump ensure that correct PPE is used.</b>

<b>Eye contact</b>	Rinse immediately with plenty of water, also under the eyelids, for at least 15 minutes. Remove contact lenses, if present and easy to do. Continue rinsing. Get medical attention immediately.
<b>Skin contact</b>	Wash off immediately with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes. Use a mild soap if available. Wash clothing before reuse. Thoroughly clean shoes before reuse. Get medical attention immediately.
<b>If inhaled</b>	Remove to fresh air. Treat symptomatically. Get medical attention if symptoms occur.
<b>If swallowed</b>	Rinse mouth with water. Do NOT induce vomiting. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. Get medical attention immediately.
